


Riley Gellatly

It has also increased my confidence and optimism, expanded my social circles and I feel empowered! I would like nothing more than to share this gift of being able to solve one of the world's most challenging puzzles with the K/W students so they too can receive the benefits and take that knowledge and empowerment and carry it forward for the rest of their lives.

I have designed a program that can teach almost anyone how to solve the 3x3 Cube in four one-hour, fun and interactive lessons. All materials will be provided for the lessons (cubes, instructions booklets, slide presentation and video demonstrations). And certificates will be issued to the students at the end of the program.

If the thought of empowering your teachers and students in this unique way interests you, then you will be thrilled to know that I will be hosting a record-breaking event in June of 2020 at the Kitchener Auditorium. It is my goal to have all 5,000 + students, teachers and other participants solving the Rubik's Cube at one time, breaking the Guinness World Record. All participants' names and their schools will be listed on the Guinness World Records website and a picture of the event will be featured in the next edition of the Guinness Book of World Records 2020. And Thanks to our sponsors, each school will also be receiving a commemorative plaque with their schools name and participating grades. There is a nominal fee of \$25.00 to participate in this event that goes towards supplying everyone with t-shirts, cubes, event passes as well as the auditorium rental, photographers and Guinness World Record representative. Each school/group/organization is responsible for transporting their students to and from the event.

On behalf of my team and myself, we thank you for your time and we look forward to working with you on empowering your students in this unique way. Together, we will be raising the bar of the emotional and intellectual levels of the next generation of kids and letting the world know that Kitchener/Waterloo stands behind its students.
